Staff in New England, Central Coast and Mid North Coast locations may wear a mask should they choose to.

The Health advice also requires that staff do not work across multiple locations in order to help contain the spread of the virus.

Brighter Access delivers a support to participants called Coordination of Supports.

A Coordinator of Supports assists participants to implement their NDIS Plans, ensuring they receive the most appropriate supports to meet their individual needs as well as fit within NDIS funding budgets. A Support Coordinator assists the participant to find service providers, community organisations and mainstream services, and supports them to make informed choices of whom they would like to deliver their supports, what activities they would like to be part of and assists with housing options.

Currently Brighter Access has Support Coordinators in Central Coast, Hunter/Newcastle, Inverell and Tamworth.
